Rev. Sheldon Culver is an ordained minister with the United Church of Christ (UCC.) She was born and raised in Boston, Ma, and came to St. Louis in 1966 to attend Washington University where she majored in Religious Studies, receiving a B.A. in 1971. She is a graduate of Eden Theological Seminary, St Louis, achieving a Master of Divinity degree in 1974. Eden Seminary awarded her the honorary degree of Doctor of Divinity in 2010.

Rev. Sheldon has served as Pastor and Teacher with UCC congregations in Southern Illinois, and Eastern Missouri. She became the Conference Minister (Bishop) of the Illinois South Conference of the United Church of Christ in 2007, moving to the community of Highland. In 2015 she retired, and has recently moved her home to Columbia, Il.

Rev. Sheldon continues in ministry as a Jungian Analyst, working with persons who seek deeper relationship with their spiritual selves. This ministry, focusing on dreams and soul's journey, brings her deep satisfaction.

She also sings with the Heartland Community Chorus. Sheldon invites anyone who enjoys the beauty and blessings of voices blended in song to come to the HCC concerts....AND, consider joining the chorus!



Fr. Richard Chiola shares:

Mark 14:1—15:47

*The Passion according to St. Mark:
A Soldier's Epiphany.*

Fr. Chiola unfolds the story of the crucifixion in Mark's Gospel. In Mark 15:39 a centurion cries out: "Truly this was Son of God."



Father Richard Chiola, ordained 1972, is a retired priest of the diocese of Springfield, IL. He is past-president of NOCERCC, the National Organization for Continuing Education of Roman Catholic Clergy. Currently Fr. Chiola has a

private practice in spiritual direction and in counseling therapy. He also gives retreats and workshops to priests, communities of religious women, and laity.

Fr. Chiola holds several degrees in theology including a Ph.D. in historical theology from St. Louis University. He also holds a M.A. in counseling from the University of Illinois at Springfield and is a licensed clinical professional counselor.

He has served as an assistant professor of pastoral theology at Yale University, a Catholic chaplain at University of Chicago, and a mission consultant for Hospital Sisters Health System. He has taught pastoral theology in both Protestant and Catholic seminaries.

Eliot received the 2015 national award from the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions. The Federation notes that Kapitan is a passionate promoter of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. He coordinated the regional RCIA training entitled “Wading Deeper.” For many years he served as a team member for the North American Forum on the Catechumenate.

Fr. Kevin Laughery shares:

Genesis 22:1-2, 9A, 10-13, 15-18

“What happens to a dream deferred? Does it dry up, like a raisin in the sun?”

Langston Hughes, “Harlem”

In Genesis chapter 22, we find one of the strangest incidents in all the Scriptural interactions between God and human beings. Abraham and Sarah had longed for a son and, after they had waited a very long time, God gave them Isaac. Then God told Abraham to make a burnt offering of Isaac! What sense can we find in this incident? What does it say about dreams deferred or dashed?

Father Kevin Laughery, who grew up in the Decatur area, is pastor of St. Jerome Parish in Troy and St. James Parish in St. Jacob.



Before coming here in 2017, he served parishes in the Springfield area for 34 years while working in the diocesan Office for Tribunal Services, and was in charge of the tribunal from 2005 to 2017. He remains a tribunal judge.

He writes for Sunday Missal Service in Quincy, and has a regular column, A Big Small World, in Catholic Times.

Father Kevin is particularly interested in anti-racism work, efforts toward Christian unity, and interaction with people of non-Christian religions.
