Dear Friends in Christ,

I am sure you are aware of the terrible tragedies resulting from the tornadoes that struck the Midwest this past weekend. We grieve for the families of those who lost their lives and pray for the souls of the departed. In our diocese, destruction of an Amazon warehouse in Edwardsville took the lives of 6 people and injured many more. Through our Catholic Charities, we will continue to seek out and assist any families in our diocese who may have been impacted by the storms.

At this time, I ask you to consider the plight of our neighbors to the south. The destruction caused by a tornado along a 200-mile path in western Kentucky is horrific. The images from towns like Mayfield and Bowling Green are unimaginable and reports of so many children losing their lives is heartbreaking. Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear declared it, "the most devastating tornado event in our history." Relief efforts of many government and social aid agencies, including Catholic Charities USA, are already in action delivering emergency service to the affected areas.

We have been in contact with the Diocese of Owensboro. They are overwhelmed with requests for assistance and the pain and suffering of so many people has taken its toll on everyone. The best way we can help is to provide financial assistance that allows the most flexibility in responding to changing needs. To that end, I am asking our parishes to consider a special collection this weekend, December 18-19, to assist in the recovery efforts for our brothers and sisters in Kentucky.
